SOCIETY ACT

CONSTITUTION
(As amended to June 02, 2001)

1. The name of the Society is:

S.T.I.B.C. Society of Translators and Interpreters of
British Columbia.

2. The purposes of the Society are:

- (i) to promote the education and training of translators and interpreters in the Province of British Columbia;
- (ii) to foster the professional development of translators and interpreters in areas of specialization;
- (iii) to regulate and govern the conduct of members by establishing a certification system and prescribing a code of ethics, rules of professional conduct and standards of practice.
- (iv) to promote public understanding and awareness of the functions and responsibilities of translators and interpreters;
- (v) to promote the professional interests of translators and interpreters in the Province of British Columbia;
- (vi) to maintain an exchange of ideas and information between translators and interpreters in this province and elsewhere;

- (vii) to ensure that members exercise high standards of professional conduct, and to examine any complaints received pertaining to the competence or professional conduct of a member.
